Limestone by regrading the lot and bringing electrical distribution and permanent lighting to that lot.	24,000	\$10,000
LexArts	Beautifying Black and Williams	Beautifying Black and Williams is a Public Art initiative that will transform the exterior and interior of an important public service facility into a more welcoming and vibrant space. A community mural will celebrates the namesakes of the Black and Williams Social Service Center, an artistic bench placed near the entrance and two dozen artworks to be placed through the interior of the facility.	20,000	\$7,500
Lexington Public Library Foundation, Inc.	Families at Play	The Lexington Public Library will create an enclosed outdoor playspace on the back porch of the Northside Branch Library. The space, and library itself, are free and open to everyone in our community.	1,000	\$2,500
Lexington-Fayette Urban County Greenspace Trust, Inc.	Dantzler Court Open Space	The City of Lexington owns over 800 underutilized open space parcels (~500 acres) throughout the city. The Greenspace Trust's Dantzler Court project will establish a replicable model for a community-driven process to enhance access and activity in these neighborhood spaces with small investments.	500	\$2,500
Seedleaf	Seedleaf Community Farm	Seedleaf proposes to erect six self-guided education stations with signage, seating and a bike rack at the Seedleaf community farm in Lexington, Kentucky. The Seedleaf Community farm is designed to be an educational growing space that highlights the possibilities of small-scale urban agriculture for sustainable local food production while also becoming a center for horticultural skill building in an economically and culturally diverse community.	1,860	\$2,500
